For 2010-2011, Wexford-Missaukee ISD Special Education did not make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) because not enough students met the state objective in ELA and Mathematics. We are actively working to address the district issues by implementing early interventions and aligning curriculum.

State law requires that we also report additional information:

3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL – Students may receive services at the Career Technical Center. Students who attend the WMCTC have an opportunity to explore and train for career options in one of fourteen programs to help them prepare for career success after high school whether it is college, employment, or the military.
4. IDENTIFY HOW TO ACCESS A COPY OF THE CORE CURRICULUM, A DESCRIPTION OF ITS IMPLEMENTATION AND AN EXPLANATION OF THE VARIANCES FROM THE STATE'S MODEL – Students at WMISD follow [Michigan Curriculum Framework](#) and us the [Grade Level Content Expectations](#) (GLCE) and [High School Content Expectations](#) (HSCE) along with the [Michigan Merit Curriculum](#) as our main curriculum guide.
